Some members of Congress are proposing an Essential Workers Bill of Rights to ensure that the workers who are required to keep society functioning during the coronavirus pandemic have the resources and safety net they need to continue doing their jobs. The Bill of Rights would contain a package of reforms to ensure that essential workers have an expanded set of worker protections and a strong safety net. An essential worker is someone who performs work that may involve the safety of human life and protection of property, and includes workers who staff businesses that may stay open during the pandemic. Proponents say that essential workers are risking their lives to ensure that society can keep functioning and that the least we can do is make sure that they have the protections they need to do their job and help them if they get sick. Opponents say that this will be an expensive increase in taxpayer costs and that companies should decide for themselves how they want to protect essential workers.
