From October 5 to November 3, 2024, Data for Progress conducted 11 pooled surveys resulting in 13,404 respondent interviews of U.S. likely voters nationally using web panel respondents. Each sample was weighted to be representative of likely voters by age, gender, education, race, geography, and 2024 vote margin. The surveys were conducted in English. The margins of error associated with each sample size is ±3 percentage points. Results for subgroups of the sample are subject to increased margins of error.
