

DATA FOR **PROGRESS**

From October 15 to October 18, 2020, Data for Progress conducted a survey of 929 likely voters in North Carolina using SMS and web panel respondents. The sample was weighted to be representative of likely voters by age, gender, education, race, and voting history. The survey was conducted in English. The margin of error is ±3.2 percentage points.

N=929 unless otherwise specified. Some values may not add up to 100 due to rounding.
