This survey is based on 1,276 interviews conducted by YouGov on the internet of registered voters likely to vote in the Democratic presidential primary in 2020. A sample of 3,166 interviews of self-identified registered voters was selected to be representative of registered voters and weighted according to gender, age, race, education, region, and past presidential vote based on registered voters in the November 2016 Current Population Survey, conducted by the U.S. Bureau of the Census. The sample was then subsetted to only look at respondents who reported they were likely to vote in their state's Democratic primary or caucus. The weights range from 0.11 to 6.1 with a mean of 1 and a standard deviation of 0.74.

The *margin of error* (a 95% confidence interval) for a sample percentage p based upon the entire sample is approximately 3.4%. It is calculated using the formula

$$\hat{p} \pm 100 \times \sqrt{\frac{1 + \text{CV}^2}{n}}$$

where CV is the coefficient of variation of the sample weights and n is the sample size used to compute the proportion. This is a measure of sampling error (the average of all estimates obtained using the same sample selection and weighting procedures repeatedly). The sample estimate should differ from its expected value by less than margin of error in 95 percent of all samples. It does not reflect non-sampling errors, including potential selection bias in panel participation or in response to a particular survey.
