

DATA FOR PROGRESS

From December 30 to December 30, 2020, Data for Progress conducted a survey of 1166 likely voters nationally using web panel respondents. The sample was weighted to be representative of likely voters by age, gender, education, race, and voting history. The survey was conducted in English. The margin of error is ± 2.9 percentage points.

NB: subgroups with a n-size less than 50 (<50) are not shown on these cross-tabs. We choose not to display N<50 subgroups because the sample is too small to have statistical significance. We did, however, take samples of these subgroups for representational and weighting purposes to accurately reflect the electorate makeup. Some values may not add up to 100 due to rounding.

[1] Currently, there are two Senate races in Georgia still ongoing, with a runoff election scheduled for early January. These races will determine which party controls the U.S. Senate.

The Democrats running promise that if they win, they will pass a coronavirus-relief bill that includes another round of \$2,000 checks for most Americans.

The Republicans running counter that trillions of dollars have already been spent on coronavirus relief and that we must cut the national debt so we don't leave an unpayable burden to our children.
