From May 28 to June 1, 2021, Data for Progress conducted a survey of 1,323 likely voters nationally using web panel respondents. The sample was weighted to be representative of American adults by age, gender, education, race, and voting history. The survey was conducted in English. The margin of error is ±3 percentage points.

[1] This week, Royal Dutch Shell, the biggest oil and gas
producer in Europe, was ordered by a Dutch court to
reduce its carbon emissions by 45% by 2030, compared to
2019 levels.

The court found that Shell's carbon emissions pose a "very serious threat" to Dutch residents, and that the company has an "individual responsibility" to reduce emissions. Shell had argued in the case that climate change is a broader societal issue, and that it wasn't appropriate to ask an individual company to reduce its carbon emissions.
