From July 28 to 30, 2021, Data for Progress conducted a survey of 1,184 likely voters nationally using web panel respondents. The sample was weighted to be representative of likely voters by age, gender, education, race, and voting history. The survey was conducted in English. The margin of error is ±3 percentage points.

NB: subgroups with a n-size less than 50 (<50) are not shown on these cross-tabs. We choose not to display N<50 subgroups because the sample is too small to have statistical significance. We did, however, take samples of these subgroups for representational and weighting purposes to accurately reflect the electorate makeup. Some values may not add up to 100 due to rounding.

[1] U.S. territories including Puerto Rico, Guam, and the U.S. Virgin Islands receive less funding for Medicaid and Medicare compared to the federal funds given to states. A law that temporarily increased federal funding for Medicaid in the territories will expire on September 30.

Members of Congress are currently negotiating on a large budget bill. Some lawmakers are proposing that the bill include funding for the public health insurance programs in the territories that is equal to what states receive.
