**[2]** Some lawmakers are proposing creating a \$45 million grant program to support states in establishing or expanding worker cooperatives. This program would provide funds and support to foster employee ownership and decision-making in businesses.

[3] Some lawmakers are proposing creating a U.S. Employee Ownership Bank under the Department of the Treasury. This bank would provide funds to help businesses transition to being worker cooperatives, where employees would own their company. The bill would also stipulate that if an employer closes a plant or facility, they would have to offer their employees an opportunity to purchase the plant or facility though an employee stock-ownership plan or an eligible worker cooperative.
