

From August 6 to 10, 2022, Data for Progress conducted a survey of 931 likely voters in New Hampshire using SMS and web panel respondents. The sample was weighted to be representative of likely voters by age, gender, education, race, and voting history. The survey was conducted in English. The margin of error is ±3 percentage points.

[10] Online voter registration (OVR) is a voter registration system that would allow citizens to register to vote or update an existing registration online.

In addition to filling out a traditional voter registration form in person, a New Hampshire resident could also choose to register to vote through a secure website designed by the Secretary of State.

The applicant's identity is verified against DMV records, meaning only eligible citizens are able to register or update their current registration information if they move within the state, and their data is submitted electronically to election officials.

[11] Automatic voter registration (AVR) is a voter registration system where anyone who provides the DMV with identification that establishes citizenship and eligibility as part of a driver's license transaction is registered to vote.

Eligible citizens receive a postcard that confirms their address and allows them to select a political party affiliation or decline registration if they do not want to be added to the voter list.

Under AVR, when registered voters move within the state, their registration is updated with their new address and they are not required to re-register.

[12] The Electronic Registration Information Center (ERIC) is a non-partisan tool used by states to maintain accurate voter registration lists. Currently, 31 states, including Maine, Vermont, Connecticut, Rhode Island, Texas, and Florida participate in ERIC.

These states share voter registration information and DMV data to identify duplicate voter registration cases, as well as registrants who have moved in state or out of state, or died, to update their voter lists and investigate potential cases of voter fraud.

[13] A post-election audit is a process that checks if equipment and procedures used to count votes during an election worked properly and that the election was correctly decided.

Currently, New Hampshire does not have a formal post-election audit process to review cases where there is concern about an election's result.
