

DATA FOR PROGRESS

From December 10, 2023 to January 26, 2024, Data for Progress conducted 4 surveys of 4,882 likely voters nationally using web panel respondents. The sample was weighted to be representative of likely voters by age, gender, education, race, geography, and voting history. The survey was conducted in English. The margin of error is ± 3 percentage points.

The first displayed result was from a survey of 1,205 likely voters fielded from January 24 to 26, 2024. The following results have their sample sizes and fielding dates listed.

NB: subgroups with a n-size less than 50 (<50) are not shown on these cross-tabs. We choose not to display N<50 subgroups because the sample is too small to have statistical significance. We did, however, take samples of these subgroups for representational and weighting purposes to accurately reflect the electorate makeup. Some values may not add up to 100 due to rounding.
