M DATA FOR **PROGRESS**

From October 25 to 30, 2024, Data for Progress conducted a survey of 1,079 likely voters in Arizona using SMS, live caller, and web panel respondents. The sample was weighted to be representative of likely voters by age, gender, education, race, geography, and 2020 recalled vote. The survey was conducted in English and Spanish. The margin of error associated with the sample size is ±3 percentage points. Results for subgroups of the sample are subject to increased margins of error. The design effect for this survey is 1.66. Partisanship reflected in tabulations is based on self-identified party affiliation, not partisan registration. For more information please visit dataforprogress.org/our-methodology.

NB: subgroups with a n-size less than 50 (<50) are not shown on these cross-tabs. We choose not to display N<50 subgroups because the sample is too small to have statistical significance. We did, however, take samples of these subgroups for representational and weighting purposes to accurately reflect the electorate makeup. Some values may not add up to 100 due to rounding.

[12] Below is Arizona **Proposition 139**, an initiative petition relating to the fundamental right to an abortion, which will appear on the ballot this November election.

A "**yes**" vote shall have the effect of creating a fundamental right to abortion under Arizona's constitution. The State will not be able to interfere with this fundamental right before fetal viability, when, in the judgment of a treating health care professional, the fetus has a significant likelihood of survival outside the uterus. The State will not interfere with the judgment of a professional that an abortion is necessary to protect the life or health of the pregnant individual, or penalize any person for assisting a pregnant individual in exercising the right to an abortion.

A "**no**" vote shall have the effect of not creating a fundamental right to have an abortion under Arizona's constitution, will leave in place current laws that restrict abortion before fetal viability, and will allow the State to further restrict or ban abortion in the future.
