

DATA FOR PROGRESS

From October 25 to 30, 2024, Data for Progress conducted a survey of 721 likely voters in Nevada using SMS and web panel respondents. The sample was weighted to be representative of likely voters by age, gender, education, race, geography, and 2020 recalled vote. The survey was conducted in English and Spanish. The margin of error associated with the sample size is ± 4 percentage points. Results for subgroups of the sample are subject to increased margins of error. The design effect for this survey is 1.57. Partisanship reflected in tabulations is based on self-identified party affiliation, not partisan registration. For more information please visit dataforprogress.org/our-methodology.

NB: subgroups with a n-size less than 50 (<50) are not shown on these cross-tabs. We choose not to display N<50 subgroups because the sample is too small to have statistical significance. We did, however, take samples of these subgroups for representational and weighting purposes to accurately reflect the electorate makeup. Some values may not add up to 100 due to rounding.

[12] On **November 5th, 2024**, voters in Nevada will decide whether to enact **State Question No. 6**, a proposed amendment to the Nevada Constitution. The text of **State Question 6** is as follows:

"Should the *Nevada Constitution* be amended to create an individual's fundamental right to an abortion, without interference by state or local governments, whenever the abortion is performed by a qualified healthcare professional until fetal viability or when necessary to protect the health or life of the pregnant individual at any point during the pregnancy?"

If passed, the amendment would be placed on the 2026 General Election ballot for final approval. If the election were held today, would you vote **Yes** or **No** on this amendment?
