

# DATA FOR PROGRESS

From April 24 to May 1, 2024, Data for Progress conducted a survey of 654 adults in California using web panel respondents. The sample was weighted to be representative of California adults by age, gender, education, race, geography, and 2020 recall vote. The survey was conducted in English. The margin of error associated with the sample size is  $\pm 4$  percentage points. Results for subgroups of the sample are subject to increased margins of error. Partisanship reflected in tabulations is based on self-identified party affiliation, not partisan registration. For more information please visit <https://dataforprogress.org/our-methodology>.

NB: subgroups with a n-size less than 50 (<50) are not shown on these cross-tabs. We choose not to display N<50 subgroups because the sample is too small to have statistical significance. We did, however, take samples of these subgroups for representational and weighting purposes to accurately reflect the electorate makeup. Some values may not add up to 100 due to rounding.

**[108]** After the 2018 Paradise wildfire, an investigation determined a powerline owned by Pacific Gas and Electric Co. (PG&E) started the fire when the line was downed during a windstorm, resulting in up to \$30 billion in economic losses and 85 fatalities.

The costs led PG&E to file for bankruptcy in 2019, and ultimately the State of California bailed PG&E out to allow it to continue to operate as a private utility.
