

# DATA FOR PROGRESS

From May 10 to 11, 2024, Data for Progress conducted a survey of 1,168 U.S. likely voters nationally using web panel respondents. The sample was weighted to be representative of likely voters by age, gender, education, race, geography, and voting history. The survey was conducted in English. The margin of error is  $\pm 3$  percentage points.

NB: subgroups with a n-size less than 50 (<50) are not shown on these cross-tabs. We choose not to display N<50 subgroups because the sample is too small to have statistical significance. We did, however, take samples of these subgroups for representational and weighting purposes to accurately reflect the electorate makeup. Some values may not add up to 100 due to rounding.

**[24]** Lawmakers have proposed the Community Mental Wellness and Resilience Act to strengthen mental health services for climate anxiety.

The legislation would establish a \$36 million grant program through the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) to provide funding to local community-based mental wellness and resilience programs. This funding would be used to address mental health issues arising from impacts from climate change, including extreme weather events, natural disasters, and rising temperatures.
