

DATA FOR PROGRESS

From June 12 to 14, 2024, Data for Progress conducted a survey of 1,234 U.S. likely voters nationally using web panel respondents. The sample was weighted to be representative of likely voters by age, gender, education, race, geography, and 2020 recalled vote. The survey was conducted in English. The margin of error associated with the sample size is ± 3 percentage points. Results for subgroups of the sample are subject to increased margins of error. Partisanship reflected in tabulations is based on self-identified party affiliation, not partisan registration. For more information please visit dataforprogress.org/our-methodology.

[19] Currently, abortion pills are the most-used method for abortion. These pills are also used to manage miscarriages and stop postpartum hemorrhaging (bleeding out after giving birth). The process involves two different medicines: mifepristone and misoprostol.
