

# DATA FOR PROGRESS

From June 20 to 24, 2024, Data for Progress conducted a survey of 1,211 U.S. likely voters nationally using web panel respondents. The sample was weighted to be representative of likely voters by age, gender, education, race, geography, and 2020 recalled vote. The survey was conducted in English. The margin of error associated with the sample size is  $\pm 3$  percentage points. Results for subgroups of the sample are subject to increased margins of error. Partisanship reflected in tabulations is based on self-identified party affiliation, not partisan registration. NB: subgroups with a n-size less than 50 (<50) are not shown on these cross-tabs. We choose not to display N<50 subgroups because the sample is too small to have statistical significance. We did, however, take samples of these subgroups for representational and weighting purposes to accurately reflect the electorate makeup. Some values may not add up to 100 due to rounding.

**[4]** This week, the U.S. State Department announced a streamlined process for DACA recipients — undocumented immigrants who arrived in the U.S. as children — and other undocumented immigrants to more easily obtain temporary employment-based visas, such as H-1B visas for high-skilled workers.

This plan is offered only to undocumented immigrants who have graduated from a U.S. college and have an offer from an American employer for a highly skilled job.
