From June 28 to July 14, 2024, Data for Progress conducted four surveys with 4,684 respondent interviews of U.S. likely voters, including 566 swing voters, using web panel respondents. Each sample was weighted to be representative of likely voters by age, gender, education, race, geography, and 2020 recalled vote. The surveys were conducted in English. The margin of error associated with the sample size is ±1 percentage point, and crosstabs of subgroups of the sample are subject to increased margins of error.
