

From July 12 to 14, 2024, Data for Progress, in partnership with Split Ticket, conducted a survey of 1,011 Black or African American likely voters in Arizona, Georgia, Michigan, Nevada, North Carolina, Pennsylvania, and Wisconsin using web panel respondents. The sample was weighted to be representative of Black likely voters by age, gender, education, race, geography, and 2020 recalled vote. The survey was conducted in English. The margin of error associated with the sample size is ±3 percentage points. Results for subgroups of the sample are subject to increased margins of error. Partisanship reflected in tabulations is based on self-identified party affiliation, not partisan registration. The design effect is 1.22.
