



From September 13 to 20, 2024, Data for Progress conducted a survey of 1,421 likely voters in New York City using SMS and web panel respondents. The sample was weighted to be representative of likely voters by age, gender, education, race, geography, and 2020 recalled vote. This sample is also weighted to account for oversamples of 100 Black, 100 Latino, and 100 Asian voters, to ensure proportional representation of likely voters. The survey was conducted in English and Spanish. The margin of error associated with the sample size is ± 2 percentage points. Results for subgroups of the sample are subject to increased margins of error. Partisanship reflected in tabulations is based on self-identified party affiliation, not partisan registration. Please note, the N size displayed in the crosstabs represents weighted N, not unweighted N, hence displayed totals may appear smaller than the actual respondent count listed above. NB: subgroups with a n-size less than 50 (<50) are not shown on these cross-tabs. We choose not to display N<50 subgroups because the sample is too small to have statistical significance. We did, however, take samples of these subgroups for representational and weighting purposes to accurately reflect the electorate makeup. Some values may not add up to 100 due to rounding.

[11] The New York City Charter, or the City's constitution, is a document that outlines the organization, structure, and powers of the New York City government.

In May, Mayor Eric Adams formed a Charter Revision Commission and gave it nine weeks to review the entire City Charter, hold public hearings in every borough, and make recommendations to change the charter.

This process led the Commission to approve five city-wide ballot measures that would change the New York City Charter on several key issues. Voters will be able to vote on these five ballot measures this November.
