From March 26 to 31, 2025, Data for Progress conducted a survey of 767 likely Democratic primary voters in New York using SMS and web panel respondents. The sample was weighted to be representative of likely Democratic primary voters by age, gender, education, race, and geography. The survey was conducted in English. The margin of error associated with the sample size is ±4 percentage points. Results for subgroups of the sample are subject to increased margins of error.
